The [2017 Voluntary Sector and Volunteering Research Conference](#) will be held on **7-8th September** at the [Nottingham Conference Centre](#). This annual conference is organized jointly by [NCVO](#), [the Voluntary Sector Studies Network \(VSSN\)](#) and the [Institute for Volunteering Research \(IVR\)](#).

It is an opportunity for academics, policy makers and practitioners to share **new and emerging research and network** across different contexts, sectors, and different parts of the **UK and internationally**.

Over two days, there will be a mix of plenary sessions, parallel paper sessions and workshops. Specific sessions for new researchers will run alongside the main conference programme. - **sectoral boundaries:** private-voluntary-public sector relations
- **funding, fundraising and philanthropy**
- **organisational management and governance**, including regulation and charity law
- **historical perspectives** on the voluntary sector and voluntary action
- **advances in theory and methods**.
