It's really easy to do it. Costumers just have to start by logging onto the website, and **the company will donate 0.5% of their purchase** to the charity of their choice. There are available almost one million of public charitable organizations.

On your first visit, you can select a charity from about **one million choices** and tens of millions of products are eligible for AmazonSmile donations. A good way to help organizations for huge shoppers.

At the moment, it is only available for **American organizations**, however, the scheme was <u>launched in the UK</u> in November with **11 major charities**, including <u>Cancer Research UK</u>, the <u>British Red Cross</u>, the <u>RSPCA</u> and **Stonewall** and UK charities are being invited to take part in this project.

This initiative could be a significant example of good practices to all online companies which would like to set aside some of their benefits to help charities and non-profit organizations.
